I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 29th April 2024 requesting information under the environmental information Regulation Act 2004 (EIR Act) regarding Energy Meter

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I would like to know:

- a) The total number of electric, gas, fuel & water meters the organisation has (billing meters and sub-meters).**
- b) The number of those meters that are manually read & recorded.**
- c) The number of those meters that are AMR (Automated Meter Reading) meters.**
- d) Across how many sites the meters distributed.**

Please note that I am only interested in the organisation's buildings - not domestic buildings associated with the organisation.
